THINKING OF STUDYING FRENCH AT A-LEVEL?

The course is divided into focused learning areas to ensure you are given the opportunity to cover all aspects of the French A Level curriculum. These areas include: translation skills, reading and listening comprehensions, essay writing and grammar, summary writing and speaking. We use a wide range of learning and teaching techniques and exciting and stimulating challenges and activities to motivate you to deepen your learning and to promote your independent thinking skills.

During the second year of the A Level course you also take on an independent research project. You will do research on a topic of interest for you that is related to the French-speaking world. It will be part of your final speaking examination. You will learn to write essays in French: both on our set film and on our set book.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Course requirements: Students must achieve at least a 7 at French iGSCE to continue at A Level. You need a love of French and a desire for challenge. You need to be motivated and willing to work hard. You also need to have the aptitude to work independently. This means, for example, the ability to review vocabulary and grammar on your own after each lesson. You need to be passionate about French culture and society.

In UVI you will be expected to watch the French TV news on a weekly basis in addition to your homework.
